

Colder weather is just around the corner! Before you buy that jacket.....consider this!

As cold weather arrives motor skills and independent dressing skills can be practiced through everyday dressing tasks. Have your child practice putting on/taking off his/her own sweater and coat, threading and pulling up the zipper. When buying new winter gear for your child consider these suggestions:

- -Try out the coat zipper. If it is hard for you to thread and zip it will be difficult for your child to practice and learn to zip/unzip by him/her self.
- -Tight elastic on the bottom of a coat often makes it difficult for a young child to thread and zip up.
- Long coats are more difficult for children to thread and zip.
- -Double zippers are harder to thread and zip.
- -A coat with a little (but not too much) growing room is often easier for children to put on and take off by themselves.
- -Mittens are easier for children to put on by themselves.
- -Don't forget boots! Once again, they need to be easy to get on and off. If they are hard for you to get on their feet; it will be impossible for them to do it. Go for the easy on and off!

Be ready for those exciting words – "Look I did it myself!"

Build Healthy Bones Now! Kathy Gaines, PT

Even though the skeletons are being taken down from store windows this month, we still need to remember to take care of our bones! As parents, there are many things you can do for your children now that will help them be healthier as adults...and taking care of their bones is no exception. Building strong and healthy bones in the early years can help prevent osteoporosis and fractures later on and into adulthood.

According to the National Institute of Arthritis and Musculoskeletal and Skin Diseases (NIAMS), bone mass that is gained during childhood and adolescence is important in determining skeletal health as adults, even into geriatric years. So, childhood is the time to build up bones as much as possible to make them strong enough to last!

Many factors that affect bone growth are out of our control as parents, but nutrition and physical activity are not. Making sure kids get enough calcium and vitamin D, as well as regular physical activity every day (30-60 minutes a day is a minimum), helps kids not only build bones, but stay healthy and fit overall.

Exercise of any kind is great, but to build bones, weight-bearing exercise is best, such as walking, running, dancing, jumping, gymnastics, soccer...anything up on your feet!

For nutrition, milk is of course a great way to get calcium, but many foods contain calcium that kids may also enjoy, such as cheese, yogurt, cottage cheese, orange juice (calcium fortified), salmon, some cereals, ice cream, turnip greens, kale, tortillas, etc. Check labels for good sources of calcium, as many kid-friendly foods now add calcium, too.
