News From the Art Room

From Ms. McDonald

This year has gotten off to a great start! We are learning art concepts and creating some beautiful pieces of art.

The Pre-K and Kindergarten classes have been working on shapes, primary and secondary colors and movement in art. They are working on creative color wheels and transportation art.

First grade classes have been working on line designs. They are creating a Mexican mask, "Metepec Suns of Mexico," through relief sculpting.

Second grade classes are learning about warm and cool colors. Right now they are creating a yarn design inspired by Mexican art called Huichol.



Third graders have been introduced to oil pastels and print making by creating forest scenes, inspired by the artist Klimt. They also started yarn design inspired by Mexican art called Huichol.

Forth grade students have been introduced to the artist Sandra Silberzweig. They have been working hard on creating abstract selfies inspired by Silberweig. At the end of each month the 4th grade students will study and work on their self portraits. You can visit this website, mappingthehumanface.weebly.com for more information.

Fifth grade students have created an original Mandela that incorporates radial symmetry and uses various color scheme. They are working on "one point perspective," creating a Cityscape.

We have about 425 students in art class each week. If you would like to send in donations, we could always use: New Crayola markers or crayons, tissues, Lysol wipes, big art erasers, construction paper, tin foil, sharpies, craft or scrapbook paper, tape of all kinds (masking, duck, washi), acrylic paints and various bits and pieces like foam, buttons or gems that the students can create with.

Dear Carpenter Families, Friends, Grandparents and Guardians,

As part of our fundraising - we collect Box Tops for Education and Tyson Project A+ labels. If you have been saving them all summer - bring them on in. It works well to stick them in a plastic bag, lunch paper bag or even an envelope. I have even seen some come in taped to a piece of paper. The companies just ask for no staples. So, whatever works best for your family is OK with us. Just get them in and keep sending them throughout the year. Something I just found this year is that Aunt Millie's is joining in with School Spirit program. Look for those on the UPC label of bread (they make several brand names). Send these in too! Coca-Cola is back online for bottle tops. We will gladly take those too.

There is no time frame for you to follow (but watch your expiration dates). Bring them in as you deem fit (once a week/month/quarter). Box Tops for Education has 2 submission dates – and I quote: "Submissions must be postmarked by November 1st for earnings to be included on December checks and by March 1st to be included on April checks." 
Last notes: Campbell's labels for education is coming to a close this year. Send in what you have that has the label with the points earned.



Club Cool is a digital publication of a graphic novel that acts as a virtual meeting place for Carpenter Cougars to share thoughts, feelings, experiences and ideas while they work toward positive change.

Contributors bring extraordinary life to their original character creations that act as Agents belonging to Club Cool's Openness and Optimism League.

Agents are sent on "missions" where they consider different ways to respond to conflict by telling their stories and writing their endings according to how they might solve certain problems.

SPECIAL AGENTS PROVIDE FOR CLUB COOL MEMBER SUCCESS

To help agents on their missions, Special Agents share their personal stories of strength, weakness, endurance and success. They help agents to realize that no one is alone in their struggles; we are all faced with difficult situations where obvious solutions don't come easy.

Through storytelling, Special Agents support junior agents in successfully completing their missions by modeling endurance, encouragement and positivity in times of conflict.

On October 25, the Student Safety and Support Committee hosted a Be SMART presentation, delivered by Carpenter parent, Sarah Martin. The campaign, developed by Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America, promotes responsible gun storage and asks all adults to take simple steps to reduce the harm that can occur when unsupervised children get ahold of an unsecured firearm. Attendees were introduced to the SMART approach, and engaged in conversation focused on changing social norms to reflect concerns of safety. The approach follows these important steps:

Secure guns in homes and vehicles.

Model responsible behavior around guns.

Ask about unsecured guns in other homes.

Recognize the risks of teen suicide.

Tell your peers to be SMART.



Pittsfield Township Department of Public Safety:
"Dispatch Operations moving to Washtenaw County Metro Dispatch and Huron Valley Ambulance"

January 1, 2018

The Pittsfield Township Department of Public Safety will join other agencies throughout Washtenaw County by moving Police Dispatch operations to the Washtenaw County Sherriff's Office (Metro Dispatch) Regional Dispatch Center and Fire Dispatch operations to Huron Valley Ambulance. Due to the reduction in Michigan's revenue sharing to local municipalities and the push for consolidation of public services, this move gives the Township time to make the necessary fiscal adjustments for providing the best police and fire services to the community. Pittsfield Township will continue to have their police and fire personnel dispatched to all calls for service; the only change will be where the dispatch services occur.

Pittsfield Fire will be dispatched by Huron Valley Ambulance beginning October 30, 2017 and Pittsfield Police will be dispatched by Washtenaw County Metro Dispatch beginning January 1, 2018, which will complete our transition to the regional dispatching model.

Residents are encouraged to sign up for alerts through "NotifyMe" at the township website, www.pittsfield-mi.gov and to also sign up for crime alerts from CrimeMapping to stay informed about reported crime in your neighborhood at www.crimemapping.com.

Accessing services at the Department of Public Safety:

- -Front Desk assistance; there will be personnel at the DPS front desk to assist with non-emergency calls and walk-in requests for information Mon-Fri, during regular business hours (or longer).
- -Records Department hours of operation remain Mon-Fri from 8 a.m. 4 p.m. Please call for assistance at 734 822-6062.
- At all three Department of Public Safety Buildings; After hours call box will be available to request assistance for emergency and non-emergency calls 24 hours a day (dials directly to Metro Dispatch).
- A telephone in the main station (6227 W. Michigan Ave.) lobby will also be available to call for assistance during open lobby hours if needed.

Residents will still have access to the following services:

- -Walk-in services at the police department (filing police reports and obtaining general assistance) will continue same as before. A support services assistant or responding officer will provide assistance as needed.
- -Vacation Property Checks (filed online at the township website).
- -Filing police reports online: please review the guidelines on what types of crimes can be reported through this system (online at the township website), www.pittsfield-mi.gov
- Requests regarding services or questions can be sent to: publicsafety@pittsfield-mi.gov
- Code Enforcement issues / concerns please call 822-2121.

These guidelines will be reviewed and updated as we progress through the transition. Thank you for your patience and understanding.
