Phase 3 of * I Got You* is in full effect and it needs **YOU** to make it even more spectacular!

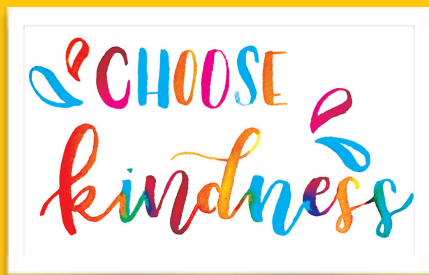
Our mission is to invite you to show us **YOUR** acts of kindness and service in the community by placing a ribbon on our trees in the front of the school.

News from the Art Room

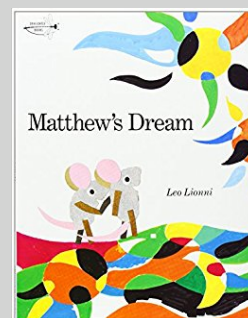


Before the break, we were creating art and building skills. Take a look at what we have been working on!

The Pre-K and Kindergarten classes have been creating pictures using ten circles and 5 lines. Kindergarten

students watched "Pete the Cat; I love my white shoes," they are now producing a composition that includes their shoes. We are always practicing tracing and using our scissors.

First Grades have been creating a shape composition that represents their "Dream." We watched the story "Matthew's Dream."



Second Grade students are still working on their creative color wheel. The students are doing an excellent job mixing red, yellow, and blue to create 12 colors. Once the color wheel is completed, the color wheel will consist of 12 colors, primary, secondary, and intermediate.

Third Grade classes studied the artist Louise Nevelson. Louise Nevelson's style of art is "assemblage" she creates compositions from recycle and found objects.

Some of our third graders are creating iPod silhouettes one-point perspective artwork.

Fourth Grade classes are creating landscapes. The students are studying the artist Jacob Lawrence "The Great Migration Series." <http://www.columbia.edu/itc/history/odonnell/w1010/edit/migration/migration.html>

Fifth Grade classes are learning American Indian symbols and incorporating them into an artistic composition. Other 5th graders are studying Diego Rivera and Henry Ford

Students created animated slide presentations of Rivera and Ford (A night at the Museum) "Detroit Industry" at the DIA. At the end of the month, the students will create an assembly line and build an original car in their groups.
