#### • President's report – Margarita Barrientes

- o Starting the new term, students are adjusting to schedule changes and 8th graders are preparing for their transition into high school, which includes PSAT testing.
- o Mr. Vazquez and the Scarlett community are very proud of the effort and thoughtfulness of the Student Council in regards to their help in the canned food drive this holiday season.
- o The Student Council Sock Hop was a huge success. The Student Council was well prepared and the dance was a positive experience for students. And the Student Council sold out of socks!
- o On January 25th, 2019, there will be an all school field trip to see a performance by African American choreographer and dancer Camille A. Brown at the Power Center. Also excited to announce that Camille A. Brown will be participating in workshops with the students.

#### Hikone Students Japan trip presentation

- o Rosa Casarella and Kalen Johnson presented a photo presentation of their experiences as exchange students in Hikone, Japan.
- o Rosa, Kalen, and 8th grade students from six other Ann Arbor middle schools experienced school in Japan, met the mayor of Hikone as well as the school district superintendent and were presented gifts. The PTSO would like to support them by giving them \$100 each toward their trip expenses.
- o Students in 7th grade who are interested can apply for the exchange program.

# • Treasurer's Report & Budgeting - Nicky Geyer, Amy Balzer-Pemberton

- o In the process of making a change to our tax status. We were previously a non-profit status, but the change can allow for more fundraising possibilities.
- o Update on the School Store and Spirit Wear sales. It was suggested that Spirit Wear could be sold before and after music concerts.
