Approval of January Minutes

Minutes were read and approved.

Principal's Report - Mr. Vazquez

- Had a great turnout at NAAPID today 102 families came through the school. People were thankful for the workshops, such as the tiers of support workshop.
- Ten teachers were out today. Some were sick and others at PLTW training.
- Mr. Vazquez is excited about carnival, which is on his birthday.
- NWEA testing is the last week in March to the last week in April. After that, 8th Graders take the PSAT. Then MSTEP testing is in May. Finals and assessments come after that.

President's Report - Margarita Barrientes

- Fun Run is still a possibility before the end of the year. Mr. Vazquez is going to see if it can be done the last half of May. Nicky mentioned that the 8th Grade fun run could also have an 8th Grade Goodbye element like a clap out done in other schools.
- Parents have asked for additional clarity on what impact the bond will have on Scarlett.

Power of Purpose Fundraiser Presentation - Jody Dungey

- Jody Dungey visited to let the PTSO know about another fundraising option for our school. The philosophy of Step it Up is to inspire students and to make less work for the PTOs. It is a no fuss fundraiser.
- The actual event is called a Day of Awesomeness that is inspired by American Ninja Warrior. They do a 30 minute kick off assembly to get kids excited. Here, they receive a parent packet including a golden ticket. Kids register online and send emails. 95% of the fundraising is done online.
- The actual event needs 8-12 volunteers and 4 trash cans. There will be 7 blow up games, Kona Ice trucks, games and a DJ dance booth. 80% of the funds raised go back to the school. It is divided into three sessions (one for each grade) throughout the day so

that it isn't too crowded and kids can have fun.

- On average, other schools in our area make over \$25,000 in gross profits.
- The event has no initial cost to the PTO. They need a soccer field-sized space for the
 event.
- The PTSO let Jody know that AAPS has strict rules on inflatables. He said that they have multiple options so that they would fall within our guidelines.
- It would be best to start the fundraising two weeks before spring break or the two weeks after spring break.

- If anyone from Scarlett signs up for the Burns Park Run, \$10 of the registration fee comes back to the school. The run is on May 3rd and parents and students can register at www.burnsparkrun.org.

Carnival Planning

The Carnival is the biggest fundraiser of the year and will take place on March 13th. We need volunteers.

- Marcos just sold its three local stores, so they will not be donating as they have before.
- Kona Ice truck will be there. They give us 25% of the profits. Will we still be doing TCBY also?
- Amy is reaching out to Pepsi for drink donations.
- A game deposit of \$807.76 has been made.
- One silent auction item will be a reserved parking spot (a principal spot) as well as seats in the front (non-student) row for events such as concerts, 8th Grade Graduation, etc.
- Leslie will reach out to parents who own local businesses via email. Also emails will be sent out asking for donations of 2 litre bottles of pop for the pop ring toss game.

- Amy asked if we can do something for Mr. Vazquez during the carnival or his birthday.
- Pie in the Face will be moved to the lobby this year.
- Games will be delivered between 2:30 and 2:45. Ms. Baugh's students will help to unload.
