Greetings From PTSO President

It's hard to believe we've moved into the second semester of the 2021-2022 school year. I wanted to take a minute to provide you with a quick review of what the PTSO has been up to over the past few months.

In October we had our most successful Fun Run event yet complete with a balloon arch finish line, DJ, and Kona Ice Truck. After a slight weather delay, we were able to host Beats and Treats as our first in person event in over 18 months at the beginning of November. Unfortunately, the cold weather and rising COVID numbers has slowed down our ability to host in person events, but we are anxious to organize more community building events when the time is right.



Thanks to our community's generous donations in the fall, we have continued to support teacher vouchers and the teacher grant program throughout the year. In addition, we have organized a monthly teacher appreciation treat to let Logan's staff know how much we value the work they are doing every day.

Our most recent project has centered around the fall fundraising campaign to enhance Logan's outdoor spaces. Over the winter break, AAPS installed a small wooden storage shed complete with a concrete pad on the upper elementary playground. With the \$1800 raised in the fall campaign, the beautification committee is working with Mr. Wright to stock the shed with playground supplies to be used when the kids are outside. Items stored in the shed will include numerous playground balls, basketballs, soccer balls, lacrosse sticks, hockey sticks, sidewalk chalk, jump ropes, hoola hoops, sidewalk chalk, and storage shelves and tubs. In addition, the PTSO is able to

match the fall donations with an additional \$1800 to purchase two commercial grade picnic tables for use on the upper elementary playground. We're looking forward to seeing everything in use very soon!



I have sincerely enjoyed getting to know and work with your children in music class this year. I love the energy and enthusiasm that has been brought to the music class-room. Students have been able to explore several different ways to express themselves musically, such as through playing instruments or through creative movement, and are excelling in music reading and singing as this year continues to progress.

In January, our Logan musicians worked very hard and learned a variety of songs to honor and celebrate Martin Luther King, Jr. Traditionally, we would gather in-person to have an assembly where these songs are performed in a school-wide celebration. However, because we cannot gather in large groups this year, each individual classroom was recorded performing their song during music class time. I am hoping to have those recordings posted to your child's music schoology page by the end of February. Thank you for your patience in waiting for your child's performance.

There are several units that are currently underway in the music room. Young 5s and Kindergarteners are currently learning about body awareness and movement. 1st and 2nd graders are refining their audiation skills and preparing for a higher level of music-reading. As for our upper elementary musicians, each grade level is starting an instrumental unit: ukulele in 3rd grade; recorder in 4th grade; bucket drumming in 5th grade.

I am excited to continue working with your students and to show them a love of all things music. Thank you for your continued support throughout this year.
