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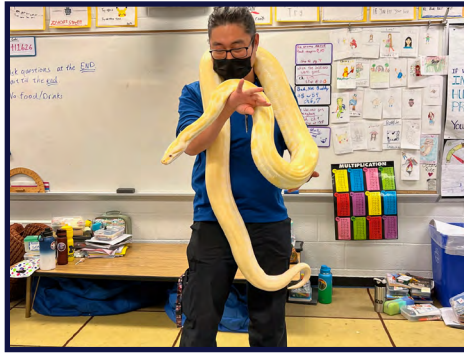

## Project Lead the Way

Project Lead The Way (PLTW) is a project-based curriculum, where students use knowledge and skills from science, technology, engineering, and design to solve engaging problems in creative and collaborative ways. Every grade level will have PLW at some point during the school year.

**Young 5s** spent the last couple of months learning about living and nonliving things. They discovered what living things need in order to survive. Students also explored different animal habitats and took virtual field trips to the Atlanta Aquarium and San Diego Zoo! Then we used the design process to sketch, build, and test an animal shelter they could take home.



**First-grade** students have completed two modules.

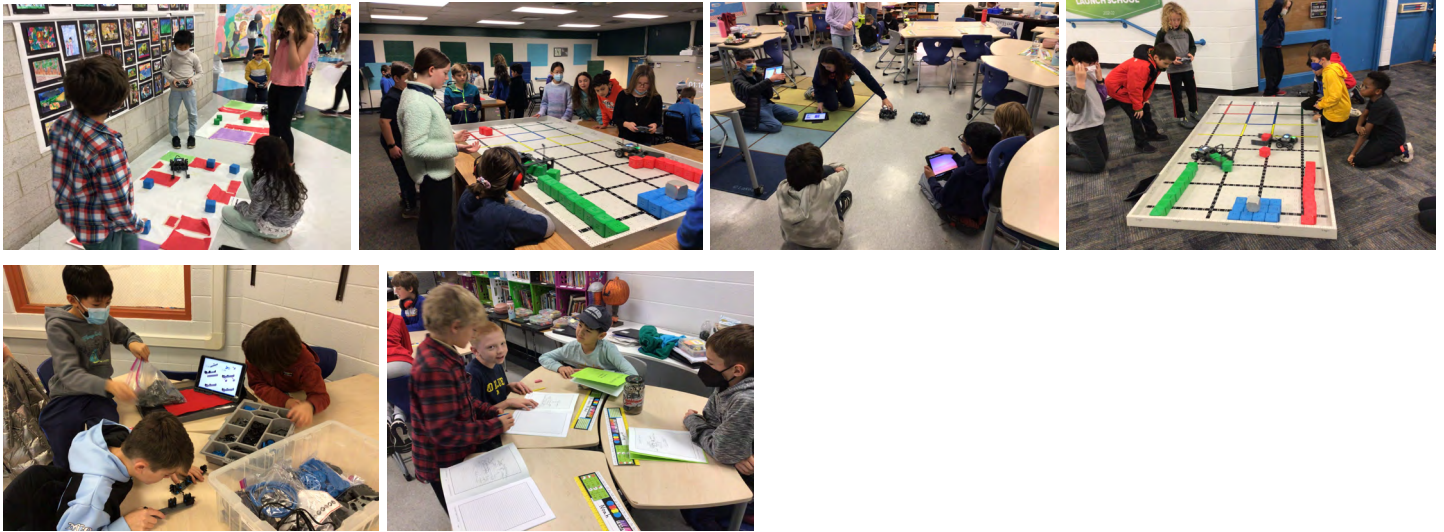
In the first module, students learned about light and sound. They explored how eyes and ears work as well as the properties of light and sound. Then students used what they learned to build a communication device that used light and sound to communicate across the classroom.

In the second module, students learned about computer science through animated storytelling. We used the app ScratchJr to learn how to program and then students programmed an animated story of their own!





**Fifth graders** have been working through two robotic modules. In the first module, students learned about different types of robots and how they are used to help people do dull, dirty, or dangerous work. Then students built a robot that they could control remotely to clean up after an environmental disaster. Next, all students participated in a weeklong Robotics Tournament to further test their skills. It's always a week of excitement and one of their favorite activities! In the second module, students learned about automation and programming robots. Finally, students programmed their robot to autonomously deliver supplies to a variety of locations within a hospital.
