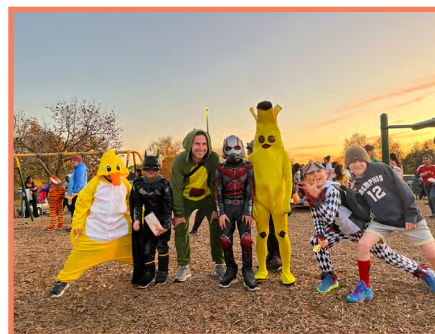
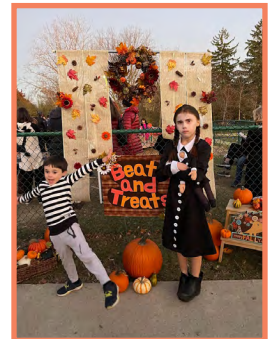

October 17-21 was **Digital Citizenship Week**. We spent time in class learning about being safe, responsible, and respectful when using technology. We did some lessons and activities based on **Common Sense Media**.

We are having so much fun in music class! We have fully swung into autumn-themed activities, where students will continue exploring their singing voices and instruments.

Young 5s and Kindergarten students are beginning to learn circle dances! We are having fun exploring musical opposites, and continue to learn how to play different instruments in the classroom. Ask your child about their favorite music room instrument to play!

1st grade and 2nd grade students are successful at reading and performing rhythms! They are also learning to differentiate between major and minor tonalities. Ask your child to create a pumpkin patch rhythm pattern for you!

3rd grade students are beginning to read and perform more complex music. We are practicing rhythms with quarter, eighth, and sixteenth notes. 3rd graders are successful at playing patterns on barred instruments. Ask your child to tell you what an ostinato is!

4th grade students will begin their recorder unit later this month. When our recorder unit begins, students will be able to take their recorders home to practice music. We will be doing Recorder Karate, which gives students an opportunity to learn, practice, and perform songs for belts to tie onto their recorders. Remind your child to bring their recorder to and from school.

5th grade students will begin a music composition unit in the month of November. We will learn about the eight musical elements, and talk about the choices composers make when writing music.

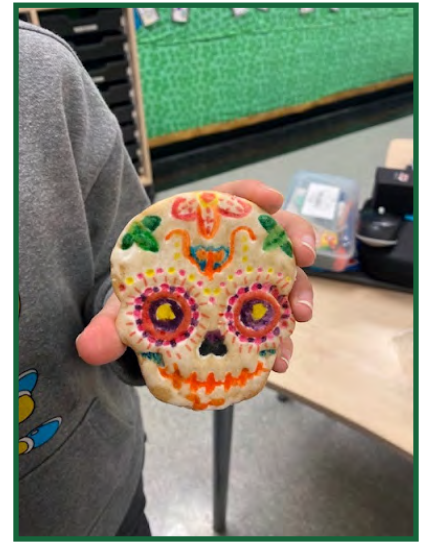
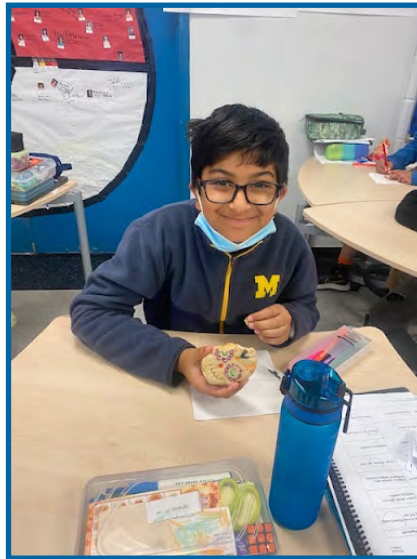
practicing saying things like, “I have a brown dog.”

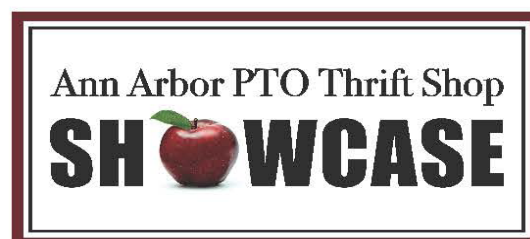
