Recent and upcoming activities connected to our subject areas:

*Writing/Word Study: This past week we learned how to write friendly letters by writing pen pal letters to our new U of M pen pals, brainstormed skills and things that writers do as they complete strong writing pieces, added to our animal structure diagrams, and enjoyed independent writing routine. Coming up, we will establish writing goals, begin our Word Study routine, and move on to our first unit of study: *Realistic Fiction Stories*.

*Reading: We are making excellent progress on our fall reading assessments, and plan to finish them early this week. Overall, the students have performed well. We are especially strong in accuracy and fluency. Our greatest need, which is the same ever year and common for 4th-graders, is to focus on


comprehension. As your child reads at home you can help build comprehension by engaging in relaxed reading conversations through the year. You can ask questions such as: What are you reading about? What is the genre? What are you learning about? Who are the characters? What is the main problem? What was the solution? Was there a

message from the author? Was there a lesson that the characters learned? Or, if you know the actual text, you can ask more detailed questions. Following the completion of our reading assessments we will be able engage more in our read-aloud, establish reading goals, work on essential reading skills, and draw closer to beginning our first reading unit: *Analyzing Characters*.


*Math: We will complete Unit 1 this week and then complete the end of unit assessment. This past week the students studied units of length (inches, feet, yards), and focused on geometry by drawing, labeling, and naming points, line segments, rays, and lines. Over the next week or two we will wrap-up Unit 1, begin Unit 2, continue practicing facts, learn a valuable routine called Partner Check, and continue DreamBox.
