

Memorandum of Agreement

between

Ann Arbor Public Schools

and the

Association of School and Community Service Administrators

The Association of School and Community Service Administrators and the Ann Arbor Public Schools Board of Education agree to the following.


In addition to her regular responsibilities as the Before/After Care Specialist II in this 2022-23 school year, Ms. Augsburger will continue to:

- Fill a critical role as coordinator of Rec & Ed's Safety Town program. This is a higher level of responsibility and authority than her regular position.
- Continue to update and develop new curricula, create a program budget and set fees, interview, hire, train and supervise about 30 staff and volunteers, and work with community partners to develop presentations.
- Assess continued expansion of the number of Safety Town classrooms and enrollment spaces. In 2022, Ms. Augsburger successfully increased the number of Safety Town classrooms and enrollment spaces and added an afternoon camp program.
- As compensation, Ms. Augsburger will receive a stipend of \$3,000, to be paid as soon as possible.

This Memorandum of Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement reached by the parties with respect to this matter, and is not precedent setting as to the master contract or the policies of the Board of Education of the Ann Arbor Public Schools.


